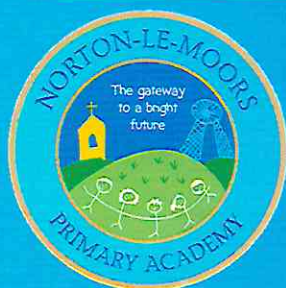

Effective from September 2025

CURRICULUM DAY VISITS

Most day visits that take place during the school day are free of charge to all pupils enrolled within the trust. This includes external transport provider costs and minibuss maintenance and fuel costs together with admission costs where appropriate.

EXTRA CURRICULAR VISITS INCLUDING AN OVERNIGHT STOPOVER

Children in Year 2 have the opportunity to take part in a 2 day/1 night sleepover at Standon Bowers in Staffordshire as part of their outward bound education. There is a small charge of £40 per child towards this visit. CHILDREN DO NOT HAVE TO TAKE PART IN THIS VISIT and can attend normal lessons in school if parents prefer.

Permission slips requiring your consent will be sent out to these classes well in advance of the residential visit. If you do not wish your child to take part in this overnight you MUST let the class teacher know and DO NOT complete the consent form as you will be charged if your child does not take part and you have not informed the school or signed the permission form in advance. The cost that you would have to pay back for the academic year 2025/26 is £114 per child.

EXTRA CURRICULAR DAY VISITS

A handful of visits take place as an addition to the curriculum offer.

In Year 5 children will have the opportunity to visit The Harry Potter World Museum. There is a cost of £30 per child towards this visit. CHILDREN DO NOT HAVE TO TAKE PART IN THIS VISIT and can attend normal lessons in school if parents prefer.

Permission slips requiring your consent will be sent out to these classes well in advance of the visit. If you do not wish your child to take part in this visit you MUST let the class teacher know and DO NOT complete the consent form as you will be charged if your child does not take part and you have not informed the school or signed the permission form in advance. The cost that you would have to pay back for the academic year 2025/26 is £89 per child.

In Year 6 children will have the opportunity to spend the day at the Alton towers Theme Park. There is a cost of £10 per child towards this visit. CHILDREN DO NOT HAVE TO TAKE PART IN THIS VISIT and can attend normal lessons in school if parents prefer.

Permission slips requiring your consent will be sent out to these classes well in advance of the visit. If you do not wish your child to take part in this visit you MUST let the class teacher know and DO NOT complete the consent form as you will be charged if your child does not take part and you have not informed the school or signed the permission form in advance. The cost that you would have to pay back for the academic year 2025/26 is £28 per child.

EXTRA CURRICULAR RESIDENTIAL VISITS

The following visits are undertaken over a longer period of time and incur a cost to parents. All of the below visits are heavily subsidised by the trust to enable as many children to access as possible.

- Paris Disneyland Monday to Friday for Year 4 to Year 6 pupils costing £350. All meals, coach and/or air transport, hotel accommodation and theme park tickets are included within this cost.
- Italian Alpes Skiing holiday Sunday to Friday for Year 5 and Year 6 pupils costing £600. All meals, air transport, hotel accommodation and ski equipment hire and tuition are included within this cost.

All extra curricular residential visits can be paid for via a monthly payment plan. All payments are non refundable unless the trust cancel a visit.

Monthly payment plans must be kept up to date or the place will be filled by another child from the waiting list. Payment of ALL monies must be paid in full before the visit takes place.

Please note that from the academic year September 2023 payments have not been able to be made by using ANY pupil premium plus funding.

Tuesday—full day out to Disneyland Walt Disney Studios followed by a fun packed evening at Mickey's Billy Bobs Restaurant with live entertainment. On route back to the hotel there is always time for a spot of shopping in the Disney Village.

6Day/5Night Residential Visit to Italy

One of the most exciting and newest Visit for Year 5 and Year 6 children!

This, in our opinion, is the best visit ever!!

After many successful residential visits, we decided to introduce a new one, one for the dared evils amongst us—so not everyone's cup of tea! However we now have some very successful skiers within the trust.

We fly to Northern Italy on Sunday morning and return the following Friday evening, with 4 days skiing in the Italian Alps.

The itinerary is as follows:

- All transport transfers from school to airport to hotel and then back to school at the end of the visit.
- Return flights from Manchester to include one piece of check-in luggage and one piece of hand luggage.
- 5 nights full board accommodation in Sestriere in the Italian Alps in a ski up to the front door hotel ensuring that the children spend most of their time on the ski slopes and not transferring back and forth from the hotel.
- 4days ski pass for the lift system across the resort
- 4days ski, boot and helmet hire.
- 4 x 5 hours a day skiing tuition with 1 ski instructors for every 10 children.
- Each day consists of 3 hours of ski school each morning, hot lunch at lunchtime in the hotel, 2 hours of ski school each afternoon, evening meal in the hotel and apres ski evening entertainment every night.
- In-house apres-ski programme (e.g. quiz, games, film night, pizza night, "bottom sledging", disco night etc).

A Visit to Santa...

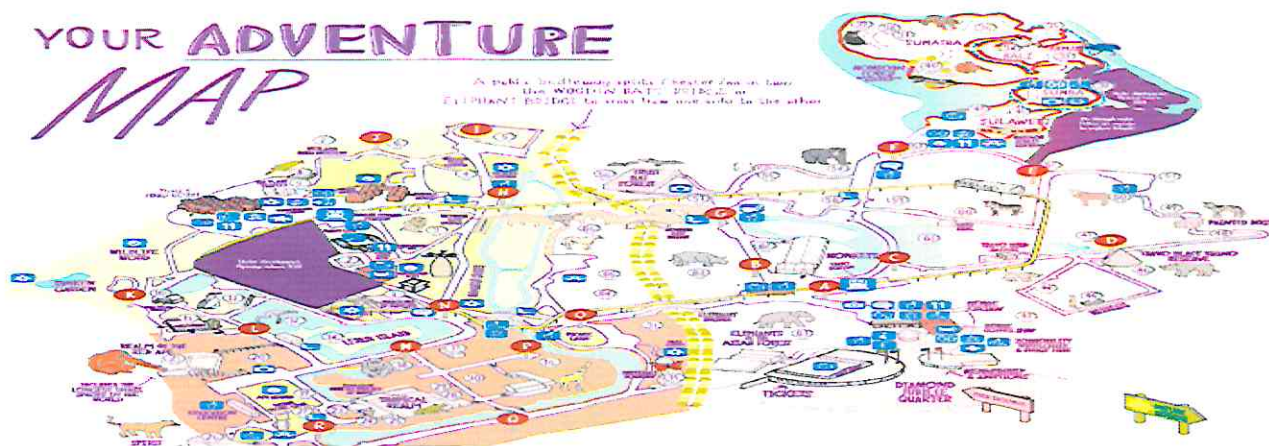

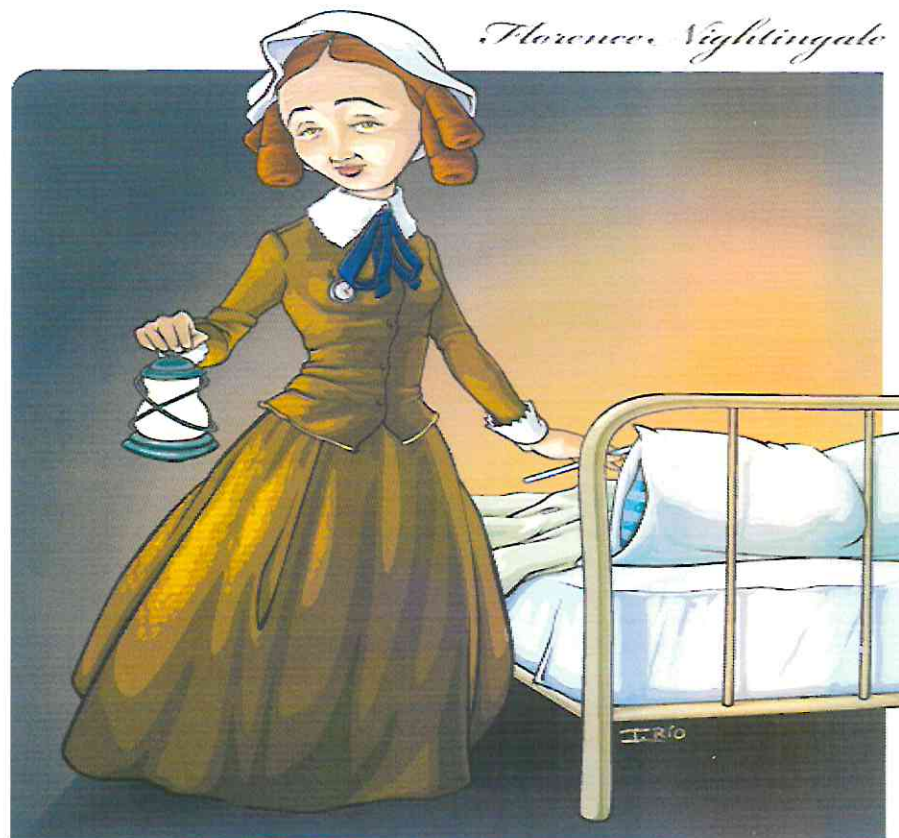

The children will meet Florence Nightingale when they arrive at the Museum .

Florence will then take your group to our Victorian Doctor's surgery. There she tells them her story of how she became a nurse and looks at some of the Victorian era doctor's equipment in the surgery. They then visit other parts of the museum including our cellar, while role playing being Florence's nurses visiting Scutari hospital. Children are chosen to help clean the hospital and catch the hospital rats. They all take it in turns to be soldiers and nurses and bandage each other. They discuss the reasons why so many soldiers died in the hospital (sanitation, hygiene, spread of disease), and the experiences of the soldiers. They will learn what happened to Florence in the years following the Crimean war and can ask Florence questions about her life. They will see Florence's lamp (replica).

Bearstone Fruit Farm Experience

- Paddington Bear loves a pot of fruit jam. As the children immerse themselves into the stories of Paddington Bear they will visit Canalside Farm.
- The children will visit the 'pick you own' strawberries part of the farm and will enjoy the freedom of wandering up and down the fruit field with their very own 'pick your own' basket.
- The Colours of the Rainbow workshop involves an interactive session with the children discussing, looking, touching and tasting different coloured fruits and vegetables. We start off with a fun and active 'bean game'. We get a large selection of fruit and veg out of the shop and talk about the benefits of each 'colour group' ie: the different vitamins, minerals and how they help to support a healthy body. For example broccoli being full of calcium that supports bone health.
- Children then try different chopped fruits and veg - maybe trying something new. And also discuss where and how different fruits and veg grow. We would have a look at our tomato, cucumber and strawberry plants growing.
- We finish off by creating individual posters. Following this will be the strawberry picking and the children can pick a small (raspberry punnet size) pot of strawberries to take home with them.

The children will have the opportunity to:

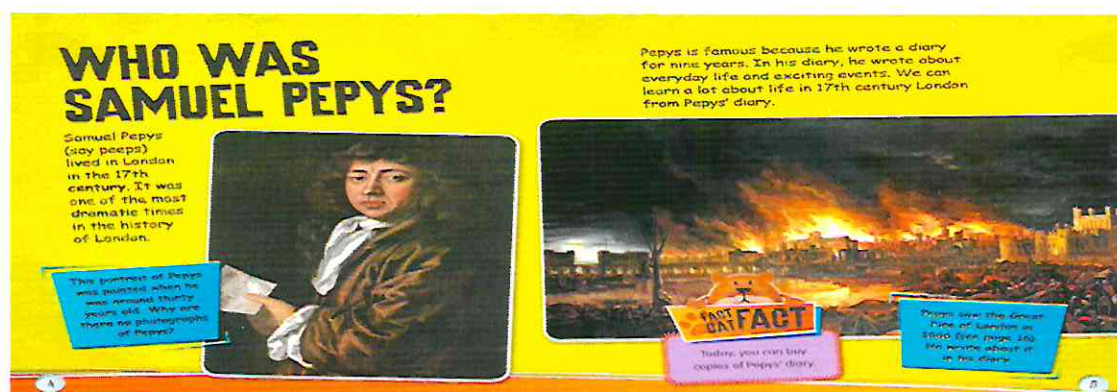
Discover the life of Samuel Pepys.

Adventure seekers...let's get to one with nature

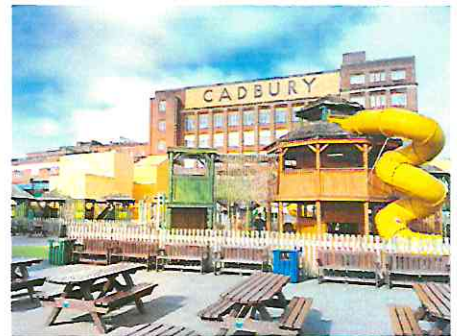
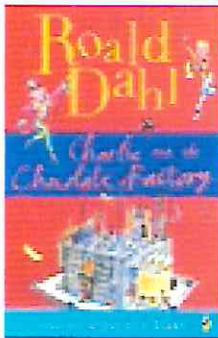
Through this topic children learn about the differences in Nature and how the natural world is so vast and so different, whilst also learning about habitats and animals who come out at night!

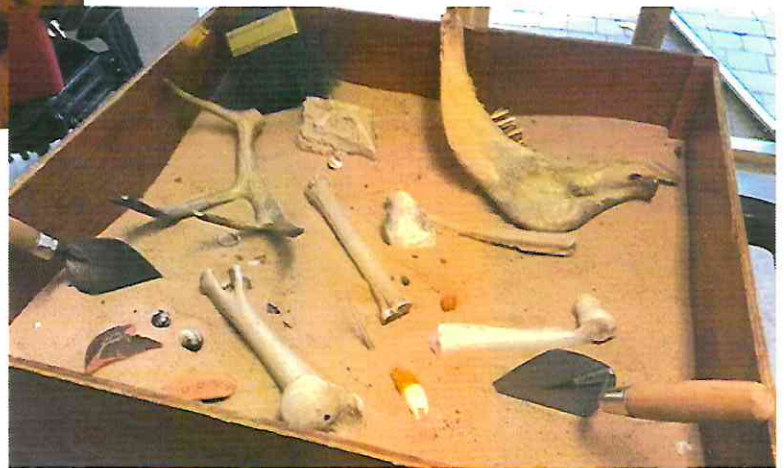

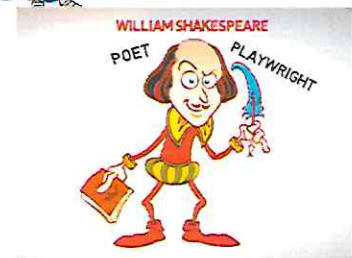
The Stone Age Story

Learn about the lives of our ancestors during the Ice Age. See the sights they would have seen and the tools they made and used. What will you find in the darkest depths of the cave? Humans have been making art for tens of thousands of years, including at our very own Creswell Crags... but why? 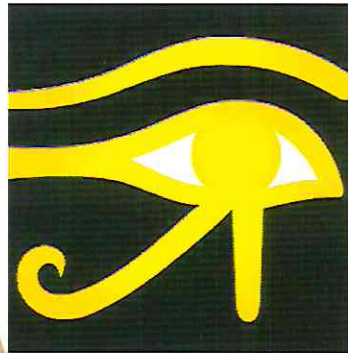


After a tour of the factory museum to see how pottery is made, the children will learn about how Wedgwood made the local area very famous.

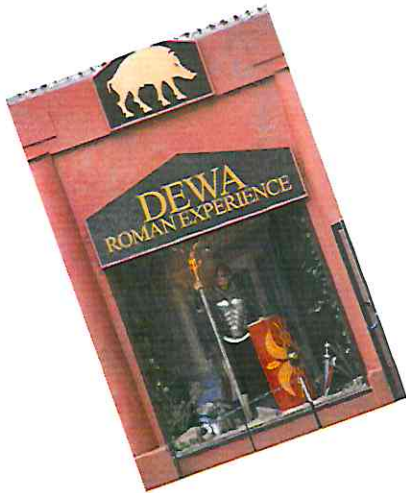

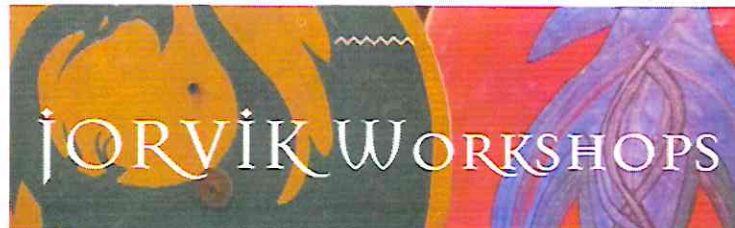

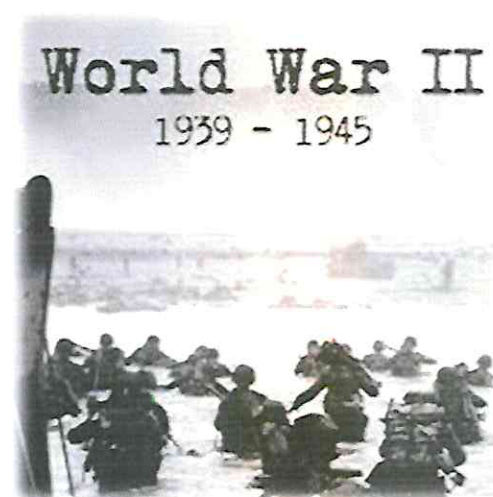
